The Women's Missionary Union of the New Era Baptist District Association is sponsoring several events for 2019.



The first event is our **New Era District WMU Winter in Spring Coat Drive**. The Lord has blessed the NED WMU to purchase 89 new coats and gloves for a fraction of the actual cost. We have sizes from newborn to children's size 18, for boys and girls.

We will donate a portion of the coats to area charities and others will go to our New Era District Clothes Closet to help anyone needing a coat in our local churches.

On April 8-9, 2019 our NED School of Missions was held at the Southside First Baptist Church in KCMO, where Rev. Raphael Williams is Pastor.



Our Study period came from the Psalms, and for our hands-on projects we completed the first phase of our **Socks for the Needy Drive**. We collected three boxes of socks. Two boxes will be sent to Rev. Francois Romelus' orphanage/church in Haiti. The remainder will be given to the City Union Mission Men's Shelter and the CUM Family Life Center.



Also during our 2019 School of Missions, we made 50 Port Pillows that were given to area hospitals. A grateful recipient shown above is with one of the Dialysis Centers in Kansas City. The 2019 hands-on project was led by Sister Tracy Reed, and Sister Barbara Spencer is our Mission Study Chairman.

In 2018, we sponsored our 1st NED WMU Day of Service to honor our 106th WMU Missionary Anniversary. This event was hosted by the St. Mark Baptist Church in KCMO where Rev. Stewart Johnson is the Pastor.



We made hygiene kits and collected clothes and shoes for all sizes, genders and seasons. We had Bibles, served food and offered prayer and spiritual counseling for all that expressed a need. Items that were not taken during the Day of Service event were later given to area charities and shelters. Our Laymen and Youth Mission assisted with our effort, and it was a blessed day in the Lord. We had several people express

a desire to learn more about becoming a Christian.
